**-Dallas County Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) member, Trusted World** will be taking donations. The Trusted World drop off location will be 15660 N. Dallas Parkway, Dallas, TX 75248. The donations center will be open daily 3 to 8 p.m., until further notice.

## Region Private Sector Update: Hurricane Harvey Louisiana/Texas Re-entry Information

<a href="#">Louisiana Statewide Credentialing/Access Program</a>	<a href="#">New Orleans Re-Entry Network</a>	Texas is a Home Rule State where each county/jurisdiction has credentialing authority.
<p>All parishes use the State Police Credentialing Requirements: <a href="#">Statewide Credentialing / Access Control Program SOP</a></p> <p>The linked SOP above is NOT intended to address the “Who” or “When” issues of Disaster Reentry: the policy decisions regarding “Who” will be allowed to reenter an emergency zone, and “When” they will be allowed to reenter, are determined by elected officials and emergency managers, ordinarily at the parish/county level, as determined by applicable law.</p> <p>The State Police Credentialing Requirements consists of a letter on company letterhead stating the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Name of individual seeking re-entry</li> <li>• Driver’s license number (you must have your driver’s license available for viewing)</li> <li>• Description of vehicle being driven</li> <li>• Company identification number (you must have your company identification available for viewing, this could be a company ID card)</li> </ul> <p>Some Parishes require additional requirements. Below you will find which parishes require additional requirements and how to go about obtaining those requirements.</p> <p><a href="#">2016 Emergency Preparedness Re-entry Credentialing Requirements by Parish</a></p>	<p><a href="http://reentry.nola.gov/">http://reentry.nola.gov/</a></p> <p>The re-entry application process is where you register your business to apply for re-entry status and receive your credentials.</p> <p>Business owners should register for re-entry ASAP to ensure they have their credentials prior to any type of evacuation.</p> <p>The purpose of the NOLA <a href="#">Regional Post-Disaster Phased Re-entry Plan Standard Operating Procedure</a> is to facilitate the public’s safety and security in the event of a natural or man-made disaster where an official Emergency Declaration has been made and remains in effect. This process has been coordinated and agreed upon by all Parish and Municipal governments in Orleans, Jefferson, Plaquemines and St. Bernard under a Memorandum of Agreement.</p> <p>The Placard System. The Regional re-entry Placard system is divided into a series of tiers based on the contribution or capability of agencies, organizations, businesses to reestablish safety, security, and viability of damaged areas. There are four Tiers in the plan: Emergency Response, Tier 1, 2, and 3.</p>	<p>Texas is called a “Home Rule” state. The county determines the re-entry process. Every county is responsible for their individual reentry procedures. The determination of the reentry process is typically based on current conditions and lifesaving requirements.</p> <p>See Attachment for Texas County and Emergency Management Contacts.</p>
